Steve Rosenstock from our research branch just stopped by to show me the new Barnes "Varmint Grenade" frangible bullet. It looks like it will be replacing their Varminator lead bullet. It's a copper-tin alloy that explodes into a powder on impact. It's not on the shelves yet, but will be soon. I'll make sure that the hunters hear about it and that Cabela's and Sportsman's carry it. Looks like we need to get out and plink some coyotes soon. Barnes 2007 line looks promising — they seem to be phasing out their lead bullets.
